General Instructions

Residents may not set out items earlier than the night before their pick-up day.

- **Material to be collected must be ready by 7:00 a.m. for collection on scheduled days.**
- Maximum quantities per pickup are three 35 gallon barrels or three bags.
- Containers may not weigh more than 75 pounds each.
- **Pathways to garbage must be unobstructed and cleared of snow and ice.**
- Metal must be removed from all rubbish and trash.

SKIPS If your garbage, rubbish, or recycling was set out by **7:00 a.m.** on collection day and was skipped, please call our office at **381-7810** and leave your name, address, date, and phone number. **Calls received before 2:00 p.m. will generally be handled on the same day.**

40 MAXWELL AVENUE FACILITY Residents may bring household garbage, rubbish, yard waste, or recycling to the facility from 8:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m. Monday, Thursday, Friday; Tuesdays from 8:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m.; and Saturdays from 8 a.m.–11:45 a.m. **NO Wednesdays and NO holidays.** Residents may be asked to verify residency in the Village of Larchmont or Town of Mamaroneck.

Garbage Collection *(kitchen/household refuse)*

DAYS/TIME Twice a week pick-up, Mondays and Thursdays or Tuesdays and Fridays, depending upon your address. Set out the night before or prior to **7:00 a.m.**

Method All garbage must be **bagged (not loose in containers)** and may be placed in waterproof metal or heavy plastic outdoor containers with secure lids.

LOCATION Must be **consistent and accessible**—either at the side or rear of the house. Pathways must be unobstructed and cleared of snow and ice.

ENCLOSURES Garbage sheds are permitted. **Sunken or in-ground receptacles are prohibited.**

Metal Items/Appliances

- White waste (i.e. washers, dryers, freezers*, air conditioners*, stoves, refrigerators*, dehumidifiers*, whole sets of pots & pans, bicycles). **freon must be removed.*

Metal will be collected by your Highway Dept. on Wednesdays. You must call your Highway Dept. to arrange for pick-up. CALL FOR PICK-UP BY 2:00 P.M. THE DAY BEFORE (metal items only)

Rubbish Collection *(bulk collection/larger items)*

DAY & TIME Your second garbage pick-up day of the week, Thurs. or Fri.. Set out the night before or prior to **7 a.m.**

LOCATION At curb/edge of property only, never in the road.

METHOD Small rubbish items must be broken down and contained—**bagged** or **bundled** & tied. See specifics below.

Acceptable Rubbish Items

- **Furniture Pieces** No more than two pieces per pick-up; any metal should be removed from the furniture.
- **Books** Hardcover only.
- **Sofa Beds** Remove metal bed frame.



- **Mattresses/Box Springs** **Must be wrapped in plastic.**
- **Wood Pieces** Not to exceed 4 feet in length and 6 inches in diameter; must be tied in manageable bundles.
- **Carpeting** Must be **rolled** (not folded) and tied; rolls not to exceed 4 feet in length.
- **Latex and Oil Paint Cans** Paint must be dried out in the cans before disposal. Lids off, cans must not be bagged.
- **Microwave Ovens** Bring to yard at 40 Maxwell Avenue.



PANE GLASS, MIRRORS, SHOWER DOORS/SLIDING GLASS DOORS will not be collected on the route. They must be brought in to the 40 Maxwell Avenue Facility.

- **Batteries**—Alkaloid and carbon-zinc batteries can be safely discarded with the household trash.

Unacceptable Rubbish Items

The following will not be collected or accepted at 40 Maxwell Avenue:

- **Automobile tires**—Tires may be returned to the dealer where they were purchased.
- **Construction debris, building materials, wood frame windows, metal frame windows and screens, tree stumps, dirt, stones, and all other NONBURNABLE MATERIALS.** If work is being done by a contractor, the contractor must remove and dispose of all construction debris.
- **Ceramic toilets and sinks, clay flower pots, ceramic tiles.**
- Extra large items including pianos, armoires, pool tables, bath tubs, etc.—**call a private carter for collection.**
- Hazardous household waste (acids, alcohols, pesticides, solvents, etc.)—call the Household Chemical Information Line at **(914) 813-5425.**
- **Long Fluorescent Bulbs**—Call Westchester County Recycling Helpline at 914-813-5425.
CFLs—True Value & Home Depot accept these.

Household Sharps (needles, syringes, & lancets)

- **Proper disposal of sharps is important to the safety of the sanitation workers.**

Use a container that is leakproof, shatterproof, and puncture proof with a screw top (durable plastic bottles such as empty bleach or detergent bottles). Put container in the garbage.



Dog Waste Disposal

All small bags should be consolidated into one plastic bag, which should then be put into the garbage can.

Recycling Collection—It's The Law!

LOCATION: At curb/edge of property only, by **7:00 AM**—never in the road.

Recyclables may also be brought to the 40 Maxwell Ave. Facility from 8:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m. Monday, Thursday and Friday; 8:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. Tuesday; and 8:00–11:45 a.m. on Saturdays—**NO Wednesdays and NO holidays.** Residents will be asked to verify residency in the Village of Larchmont or the Town of Mamaroneck. Commingled containers and recyclable paper are **NEVER** to be mixed in the same container.



Co-Mingled plastic, glass, metal containers. (Pick-up day Wednesday)

RECYCLABLE CONTAINERS

YES: Plastics marked $\triangle 1$ through $\triangle 7$, Glass Jars, Beverage Bottles, Empty Aerosol Cans, Food Jars, Beverage Cans, Aluminum Foil/Trays, Detergent Bottles, Cardboard Egg Cartons

NO: Plastic Bags, Rigid Plastics, Toys, Bulk Metal/Paint Cans, Metal Hangers, Silverware, Pane Glass, Glassware, Milk Cartons, Styrofoam Egg Cartons, Packing Peanuts

Glass, plastics, and metals are to be placed in an open garbage can or a plastic bin **only**. Bins are available at a cost of **\$10.00** per bin and **\$5.00** per lid; they may be purchased at the Mamaroneck Town Center or Larchmont Village Hall.

RECYCLABLES MAY NOT BE SET OUT IN PLASTIC BAGS. ALL CO-MINGLES MUST BE RINSED OUT AND FREE OF FOOD AND SOIL.

Recyclable Paper

(Pick-up day Wednesday)

Paper must be placed in a separate bin. Recyclable paper must be clean. **ALL PAPER ACCEPTED INCLUDING:**

- **Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogues, Junk Mail, Office Paper, Telephone Books, Paperback Books,** brochures, advertisements, letters, and paper envelopes can be placed together in a brown paper bag, corrugated cardboard box, or tied with string.
- **Brown Corrugated Cardboard, Gray Cardboard** (cereal boxes, pizza boxes). Remove extraneous adhesives and staples. Cardboard must be flattened, bundled, and tied.
- **Brown Paper Bags** Fold additional bags into one bag.

E-Waste

- E-waste is “electronic-waste.” Computers, televisions, VCRs, stereos, copiers, fax machines, microwaves, and small appliances.
- E-waste also includes Cathode Ray Tube (CRT) Appliances. CRTs include any type of television set and any type of computer terminal or monitor.
- E-waste will **NOT** be collected with rubbish or garbage.
- Residents of the unincorporated Town or Village of Larchmont may bring E-waste to the 40 Maxwell Avenue recycling center. For directions to the center call 381-7810.
- **What should I do with my electronic discards?** Think “Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.” Reduce your generation of E-waste through smart buying and good maintenance. Reuse still functioning electronic equipment by donating or selling it. **Recycle components at the 40 Maxwell Avenue yard in Larchmont or the Household Material Recovery Facility in Valhalla.**
- **Important Reminder:** Many electronic products (computers, cell phones, PDAs, etc.) store personal information. Remember to remove all sensitive and personal information from its memory. Note that simply using your keyboard or mouse to delete files does not completely remove the information. Your local software store can provide you with the necessary drive cleaning software appropriate for your system.



Organic Waste Collection: April 1–October 28, 2016

ORGANIC WASTE INCLUDES LEAVES, GRASS CLIPPINGS, PLANT TRIMMINGS, BRANCHES & TWIGS—NO DIRT. NO ROCKS.

ORGANIC WASTE MUST BE DISPOSED OF IN PAPER BIO-DEGRADABLE BAGS OR CANS FREE OF GARBAGE. Beginning October 31st, all organic waste except fall leaves must be taken to the 40 Maxwell Avenue Recycling Center. Current New York State and Westchester County regulations prohibit mixing organic waste with regular garbage.

Fall leaves will be collected by the Town of Mamaroneck Highway Department beginning Monday, October 24, 2016 and ending December 21, 2016, and in the Village of Larchmont beginning October 11, 2016 and ending December 30, 2016. **Leaves may be raked loose to the curb or in bio-degradable bags and cannot be mixed with any tree or brush debris. If leaves are mixed with brush they WILL NOT be picked up. Once fall leaf collection has begun, all other organic waste must be taken to 40 Maxwell Avenue Recycling Center.**

RULES

✓ **In 2016, for the residents of the Unincorporated Town of Mamaroneck and the Village of Larchmont:**

Organic Waste Collection Day

If your garbage is collected on Monday/Thursday
If your garbage is collected on Tuesday/Friday

- ✓ Organic waste must be placed at the curb for collection. Organic waste may not be set out earlier than the evening before the scheduled collection day.
- ✓ Organic waste must be put in **biodegradable brown paper bags** or a garbage can. **Plastic bags are prohibited** and garbage cans must be free of garbage. Containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- ✓ Tree branches and twigs cannot be longer than 4 feet and no more than 4 inches in diameter. Branches and twigs may be tied or put in biodegradable brown paper bags or in a garbage can that is free of garbage.
- **Holiday Season Trees—Dec. 29–Jan. 16.** Will be picked up by your Highway Department after the season. Place trees at curbside. Wreaths will be collected from curbside on the second day garbage pickup. **Holiday trees set out after January 16th must be cut into 4' pieces, tied and taken to the 40 Maxwell Avenue yard.**



Westchester County Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF)



The County has opened a permanent Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) on the Grasslands Campus in Valhalla. The H-MRF accepts household chemicals, electronics, Freon containing appliances, scrap tires, BBQ tanks, and confidential documents for shredding. The H-MRF will be open 3 days a week, including Saturdays. Residents must schedule an appointment to deliver waste to the site. Furniture Sharehouse

Do you have gently used furniture that you can't find a new home for? The Town of Mamaroneck, Village of Larchmont and Furniture Sharehouse have teamed up to make it easy for you to get your furniture directly to families in need to help them "make a house a home."

Available now at the 40 Maxwell Avenue Recycling Facility is a 20' container to collect gently used furniture for distribution directly to families moving out of homeless shelters, escaping domestic violence or recovering from disasters. **Furniture drop-offs will be accepted at 40 Maxwell Avenue at the following times:**

Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m.
Saturday 8:00 a.m.–11:45 a.m.
CLOSED WEDNESDAYS

Only certain types of furniture in Good Condition can be accepted at this location. Details are posted at the 40 Maxwell Avenue facility and on the Town of Mamaroneck and Village of Larchmont web sites.

"The Town of Mamaroneck and Village of Larchmont have a long history of successful material recycling. This collaboration will further our efforts to keep as much reusable material out of the waste stream as possible," says Town Supervisor Nancy Seligson. Mayor Anne McAndrews commented that "Everyone hates to see perfectly good furniture placed at the curb for disposal. Working with the Furniture Sharehouse we can provide usable furniture to those families unable to afford basic needs for their apartments."

Since 2007, Furniture Sharehouse, Westchester's Furniture Bank, has distributed over 32,000 items of free furniture to more than 2,100 Westchester families in need. Furniture donations are collected in a warehouse at the Westchester County Airport and clients must be referred by member social service agencies in order to obtain furniture. "We are very excited about working with the Town and Village. Programs like this help us save on expensive trucking costs for collecting furniture in one location," says Kate Bialo, Executive Director of Furniture Sharehouse.

Furniture Sharehouse also accepts furniture donations at its Westchester County Airport location, and pickups are available for qualifying items. For more information and complete Donation Guidelines go to www.furnituresharehouse.org
