New Solar Array Installed at the Madison County Landfill October, 2014

The poles are set and the panels have arrived for the new solar array at the Madison County Landfill. The array is comprised of 210 3x5 panels connected via a plug-in system located on the back of each panel. This is a free standing 50 kW photovoltaic (PV) solar electric system to be located in the field across from the solar array currently on the southern facing slope of the west side landfill.

The project is being installed by Solar Liberty of Buffalo, NY. In 2013, the County signed a 15 year contract with the company to place the array at the Buyea Rd. landfill site. Solar Liberty will assume financial responsibility for equipment and installation of the solar array; the County is responsible to pay .05 cents for the kilowatts produced with a limit of 50 kW for the project. Electricity generated from this solar project will provide power to the landfill maintenance building.


