The EMC will recommend to the Town Board that it consider joining "Climate Smart Communities." Jason Mayer, representing Gardiner's Climate Smart plan, made the

following presentation:

Gardiner became a Climate Smart Community January 2018.

Ulster County and 1/3 of New York State have already signed on.

Purposes: reduce greenhouse gases

prepare for disaster effects e.g. flooding

build a green economy, e.g. farmer's markets

What is in it for the town?

Taxpayers save through town's lower energy cost (and ener,

DEC provides funding for climate change projects

DEC and NYSERDA give free tech assistance

Community health issue addressed: clean air and water, hea

Interested residents can apply for grants

Procedure: Town Board adopts the pledge; then you're "registered.

Then accumulate points by taking specific measures

After 120 points you become "certified" - eligible for better g

(Ultimately it is free of cost)

Create a task force with various kinds of people, e.g. busines:

Wetlands

Our input to Planning Board's wetlands law in process:

Include a 50-foot buffer on all named streams

Dave Tompkins submitted recommendations about wetland

applicants; we are working on adjusting it.

Plastic Bags

Dave Haldeman composed a resolution to the County Energy and E

Committee (to be submitted at their public hearing June 19) stating

legislation banning single-use plastic bags. Approved unanimously.
