BEAT THE HEAT: Extreme Heat
Heat related deaths are preventable.

WHAT: Extreme heat or heat waves occur when the temperature reaches extremely high levels or when the combination of heat and humidity causes the air to become oppressive.

WHO: Children, older adults, people with disabilities, chronic illnesses, and those who lack resources.

WHERE: Home, school, work, and community centers.

HOW to AVOID: Stay hydrated with water, stay cool in air conditioned spaces, avoid strenuous activities, wear light weight, light colored loose fitting clothes.

A GUIDE TO BEACON RECYCLING

Ensure your recyclables are rinsed and free of food residue!

Place recyclables together loose in bin, and not bagged

If in doubt, throw it out - in the trash can! (Don't Wish Cycle)

RIGID PLASTIC	Beverage containers: jugs, bottles, cups. Food containers: clear clamshells, tubs, laundry detergent bottles	Plastic bags Straws Plastic utensils Caps: smaller than a quarter Plastic wrap Styrofoam Items smaller than a credit card
PAPER & CARDBOARD	Newspapers, magazines, and brochures Paper bags Mail including junk mail Envelopes with plastic windows Phone books Waxed cartons (ie juice, milk) Shredded paper in a clear bid bags Corrugated cardboard and paperboard boxes Paper towel and toilet paper rolls Foil lined cartons (for soup stock etc)	Soiled paper: food-soiled plates, pizza boxes Tissues Paper towels Coffee cups or lids
METAL	Aluminum and metal cans Metal jar lids and caps Empty aerosol cans Rinsed foil wrapping, pie plates, and trays	Hangers: return to dry cleaner Scrap metal: bring to a scrap metal recycler Foil juice pouches
GLASS	Bottles and jars Food containers Beverage containers: all cleaned glass products, even broken	Pyrex Ceramics Light bulbs Window glass
