Trustee Carpenter had nothing to report.

Trustee Kagan reminded all residents the MyVoP application is not for emergency use. If you have an issue, report it directly to the Police Department. Mayor's Report

Mayor Mullen updated everyone on the negotiations with Pelham House for the development of the area around the firehouse and the creation of the new municipal center that will consolidate our police department, fire department and village hall into one building. He thanked the Pelham House team.

He then shared the state-wide sales tax increase and expressed the anticipated rise in revenue for the Village.

<u>Item # 12 - Amending § 90-42 Schedule IIIA: Prohibited Turns at Intersections, As</u> Authorized by § 90-6 of the Code of the Village of Pelham

Resolution Amending § 90-42 Schedule IIIA: Prohibited Turns at Intersections, As Authorized by § 90-6 of the Code of the Village of Pelham

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Pelham has found that the traffic and parking conditions at the intersection of Colonial Avenue and Boulevard require prohibiting traffic traveling east on Colonial Avenue from making a left turn at the intersection with the Boulevard and prohibiting traffic traveling east on Boulevard from making a right hand turn at the intersection with Colonial Avenue and also require making the two prohibitions effective from 6:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. and from 3:00 p.m. through 7:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday; and

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Pelham has found that prohibiting traffic traveling east on Colonial Avenue from making a left turn at the intersection with the Boulevard and prohibiting traffic traveling east on Boulevard from making a right hand turn at the intersection with Colonial Avenue and that making the two prohibitions effective from 6:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. and from 3:00 p.m. through 7:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday would benefit the health, safety and welfare of the public.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that § 90-42 Schedule IIIA: Prohibited Turns at Intersections, as authorized by § 90-6 of the Code of the Village of Pelham, is amended to prohibit traffic traveling east on Colonial Avenue from making a left turn at the intersection with the Boulevard and to prohibit traffic traveling east on Boulevard from making a right hand turn at the intersection with Colonial Avenue and to make the two prohibitions effective from 6:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. and from 3:00 p.m. through 7:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Pelham has found that the traffic and parking conditions on Ancon Avenue at the intersection Kings Highway in the Village of Pelham require that the east side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 15 feet north and on the west side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 84 feet north should be areas where there is no parking any time; and

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Pelham has found that prohibiting parking at any time on the east side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 15 feet north and on the west side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 84 feet would benefit the health, safety and welfare of the public.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that § 90-49 Schedule X: No Parking Any Time, as authorized by § 90-15 of the Code of the Village of Pelham, is amended to include the east side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 15 feet north and the west side of Ancon Avenue from Kings Highway to a point 84 feet north.

<u>Item #15 - Adopting a Complete Streets Policy</u>

Resolution Adopting a Complete Streets Policy

Whereas, the Village Board of Trustees passed a resolution adopting New York State Climate Smart Communities Pledge on February 12, 2019; and

Whereas, Complete Streets is a component of the Climate Smart Communities certification; and

Whereas, New York State passed the Complete Streets law in 2011 that requires Complete Streets design guidelines be considered for the planning, design, construction and reconstruction of roadways receiving federal and state funding; and

Whereas, Complete Streets are streets that provide safer conditions for users of all abilities and all modes including residents, pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and transit riders; and

Whereas, the mission of the Village of Pelham Complete Streets Task Force is to promote the safety of all users by coordinating community input to Village's efforts in the areas of roadway engineering, traffic enforcement and public education; and

Whereas, the Complete Streets Task Force will consist of a liaison from each of the following:

Sustainability Advisory Board Board of Trustees Planning Board Village resident volunteers; and

Whereas, a Complete Streets analysis would identify and measure potential improvements and provide support for the implementation of Complete Streets policies in the Village of Pelham; and

Whereas, a Complete Streets analysis will be used to plan, design, and implement roadways that provide safer conditions for all users; and

Whereas, Complete Street design features may include sidewalks, paved shoulders suitable for use by bicyclists, lane striping, bicycle lanes, share the road signs, crosswalks, road diets, pedestrian control signalization, bus pull outs and shelters, pedestrian curb ramps, and traffic calming measures;

Whereas, Complete Streets Policy supports economic development by providing a more equitable transportation system for all users; and

Whereas, adoption of a Complete Streets policy acknowledges that everyone has the right to move safely in their communities, and aligns with the Vision Zero philosophy that serious injuries and deaths from traffic crashes can be prevented through the involvement of system designers and policy makers in ensuring safe systems for all modes of travel; and

Whereas, Complete Streets has the potential for improving physical and mental health; and

Whereas, Complete Streets designs practices, to the extent feasible; and

Whereas, Complete Streets shall be consistent with and assist in achieving the goals and recommendations set forth in the Village Comprehensive Plan, and the Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Assessment; and

Whereas, the people of the Village of Pelham have expressed strong support for creating a safer and more sustainable transportation system; and

Whereas, Complete Streets is supported by the Institute of Traffic Engineers, American Planning Association, American Association of Retired Persons and many other transportations, planning and public health professionals and organizations;

Now, therefore be it resolved, that the Village of Pelham Board of Trustees hereby adopts the Complete Streets Policy whereby all street projects including design, planning, reconstruction, rehabilitation, maintenance, or operations by the Village of Pelham shall be designed and executed in a balanced, responsible, and equitable way to accommodate and encourage travel by bicyclists, public transportation vehicles and their passengers, and pedestrians of all ages and abilities; and

Be it further resolved, that the Village of Pelham Board of Trustees will strive to initiate the recommended action items, including establishing a Complete Streets Checklist.
