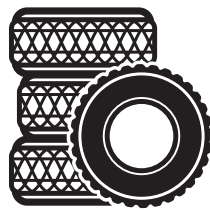
Drop-offs, pickups and seasonal items.

Put your leaves in clear bags, and bundle your branches and sticks. Christmas trees will be collected and turned into compost.

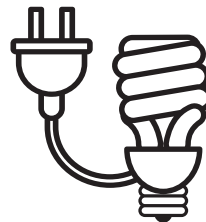

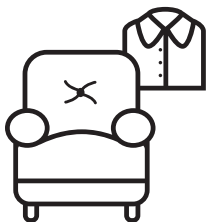

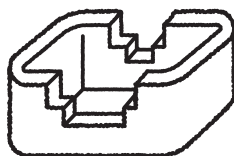
