

# Food Scrap Collection Comes to Marbletown

Save Money, Reduce Landfill and Improve Soil

## HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

You'll need to get or use your existing permit for the recycling center. Bring any items in the YES! column to the transfer station in a container that you will use to dump the material into the composting bin. You will take the container home with you. You cannot dump a plastic or paper bag into the bin. Just the organic material. Please make sure the stickers are off all fruit and vegetable skins, and that the staples are out of any tea bags. There is no charge for this and your card won't be marked.

# FREE Food Scrap Collection For Marbletown Permit Holders

Cut Your Trash Bill With Transfer Station Composting

The Transfer Station in High Falls is giving you one more way to cut the amount of garbage you pay to throw away.

Separate all the items in the middle column and never deal with smelly garbage again.

Almost all organic material is accepted. Collect it in a container, drop the contents in the green compost bin at the Transfer Station and take your container back home with you.

Reminder: Permit holders can also drop off all other recycling for free.

Metal and Glass  
Liquids and Grease  
Styrofoam  
Coated Paper  
Chemicals  
Frozen Food Boxes  
Waxed Cardboard

## Compostable Plastics

Do not include them. They contain plasticizers, which are not accepted for use on organic farms.
