SHADE STRUCTURES & COMPLETE STREETS POLICIES

Mayor Ruda opened the public hearing at 7:15 p.m. and read a summary of the following public notice that was advertised and published in the Lancaster Bee.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE; That the Village of Lancaster Board of Trustees will conduct a public hearing in the Council Chambers of the Lancaster Municipal Building, 5423 Broadway, Lancaster, New York on Monday, March 14, 2022 at 7:15 PM to consider a proposed Village of Lancaster Shade Structures Policy and a proposed Village of Lancaster Complete Streets Policy.

The full text of the proposed policies may be reviewed at the Village of Lancaster website www.lancastervillage.org or reviewed during office hours at the office of the Village Clerk, Lancaster Municipal Building, 5423 Broadway, Lancaster, NY.

At said hearing, all persons so desiring shall have the opportunity to be heard. Written comments may be submitted to the Village Clerk's office or by emailing mstegmeier@lancastervillage.org prior to 4:30 PM on Monday, March 14th.

Audience Participation:

Gavin O'Brien – 10 Livingston Street: He supports both policies. For the Shade Structures Policy, he likes having a priority given to shade trees as a beautifying feature and a positive climate impact. He noted that the Village's Forest Advisory Board also supports this action. For the Complete Streets Policy, he commented that the policy will be a benefit with new developments to provide traffic calming efforts. He wants to see these efforts continue into the future to address the ongoing impact from developments.

James Sinner – Lancaster Bee: He questioned the enforcement of these policies if adopted.

Mayor Ruda commented that conversations will be held at the planning level as new projects come forward. She clarified that these polices would affect new developments in the future rather than existing developments already in place.

Mayor Ruda noted that the approval of these 2 policies may be included as part of the Climate Smart Communities application for bronze certification.
