IMMERSION SUMMARY NOTES:

Programming & Uses Discussion:

- Fire truck parade
 - o Saturday after thanksgiving
 - o 200 fire trucks
 - Goes down central people park on the site
 - o 10,000 12,000 spectators
- 4th of July event
 - Streets closed
- There is no current development plan for SW corner of the site
- Central closes to traffic during parades
- Only 1 bike rack on main
- Interest in more bike usage

W. Main Today Notes:

- Brand/Awareness
 - 1 way traffic is a detriment
 - Need 2 way the entire length
 - Used to be 2 way historically in the same ROW
 - 2way requires reconfiguration/bump out
- Do not want signal at central
- Pedestrians cross from senior towers to grocery
- Need pedestrian walkway from W. Main to the park
- Need to balance pedestrian ROW needs
 - o Patios
 - o Street trees
 - o Grates
 - o Planters
 - Can bump outs accommodate tree pits
- Parking may require shift in habits



- Maximize street parking
- Pleasant Ave.
 - Can we road diet and add parking??
- Most parking is not privately owned & allocated
- Opera house constrains parking on weekends
- Tote/Dumpster storage
 - o Looking to establish 3 dumpster locations (already approved) for downtown businesses
- Snow is trucked out as needed
 - Piled at end of w. main on sidewalks and removed by hand
 - Wider pedestrian space will help snow removal
 - Radiant sidewalks?!?!?!
- Wayfinding
 - Tom working on a CBD map for brick pillar at central
 - Do not want huge signs in historic district
 - There is a DT Lancaster logo/brand
 - Gateway designation
 - Movable tables/chairs???
 - Maybe move clock currently on pleasant Ave
 - What is Lancaster's Chicago Bean?!?!
 - Niagara Hobby Caboose??
- Deliveries
 - o 53' Trucks can't directly access businesses on main
 - o New de4velopment needs alleyway
 - Front door delivery
- Lights
 - Prefer smaller pole top lights
 - Priority on lighting sidewalks
 - Pathway lights on creek should match
- Supermarket configuration will stay as is
- Residents need reserved parking (40 cars for new development)
- Fire protection & EMS access needs to be considered
 - Where do hydrants go?
- Need dog amenities greenspace
- Precedent places
 - o Santa Barbara Parking Strategy

 - o Hamburg
